

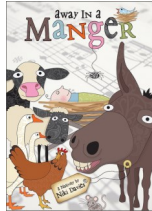

Wrens class Nativity—Away in a Manger

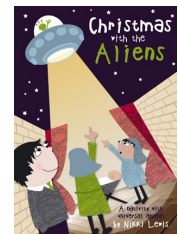

We believe this will improve the children's experience during lunch play, especially during the more extreme weather, and will give more curriculum time in the afternoons for learning. Teachers will make decisions on a daily basis with regards to a short mid-afternoon break outside for their class.

Multiplication Tables Check

You may have heard in the news that the government are introducing a Multiplication Tables test for pupils in Year 4 from September 2019. This will be a timed online test that children will take in school. Fluency and rapid recall of multiplication facts is a crucial part of maths learning for children and really assists them in their ability to tackle more complex calculations and solve trickier problems. We appreciate the help that many parents give in supporting their child to learn and practice times tables. We will continue to encourage these skills in school and give the children opportunities to practise timed recall. We have an opportunity in June to give our current Year 4 pupils a chance to try the new online test. This is not a statutory requirement this year, but we propose to go ahead with this as a useful assessment opportunity. We will of course prepare the children for these as well as we can and provide you with updated information nearer the time.

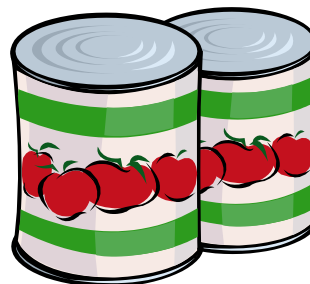
